December 19, 2016

The closed session meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM; all Committee members were present. Resolution 12-19-16 was adopted to go into closed session to discuss the Ikea Drive/Camuto update, administration staffing, court room sound system improvements, retirement of a firefighter and contracts.

The regular meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM by Mayor Daniels. Requirements of the Sunshine Law were read. This meeting was advertised in the Burlington County Times on December 8, 2016. The flag was saluted. There was a moment of silence.

Scheduled Appointments

Resolution #132-16 Hire Police Officer Anthony Schallus – all voted yes; Ms. Chang voted no. She isn't opposed to the new officer but doesn't think our force is diverse enough so she has to vote no.

7 PM - Mayor Daniels swore in new Police Officer Anthony Schallus.

A five minute break was taken. The meeting was called back to order at 7:19 PM.

Public Comments on Agenda Items

Vernita Jones – asked about Resolution #127-16 (fire truck repairs) and Resolution #128-16 (transfer of Appropriation Funds). She asked where the funds to repair the fire truck will come from. \$10,000 will come from this year's budget and the other \$10,000 will come from next year's budget according to Administrator Carrington. She asked if these were necessary repairs. They are needed repairs as explained by Mayor Daniels.

Janet Curran – asked about the Municipal Park Development Program grant. She wanted to know what improvements are needed at the Sports Complex. We need so many other things, why are we spending money on the Sports Complex. Administrator Carrington explained that the baseball fields need netting installed for liability purposes. The remainder of the money will go to the Deacon Farm if we are successful in securing the grant. Ms. Curran wanted to know if the Sports Complex was making money. Mayor Daniels explained that the Township recreation programs fund themselves and that this isn't a repair, it is a capital improvement. Many Burlington County children and adults use these fields according to Ms. Carrington so this is an appropriate use for the funds. Ms. Curran stated that she didn't think it was proper for Ms. Chang to have said what she said at the meeting tonight about the police officer. She also wanted to know why we were having the reorganization meeting at 5 PM; lots of people will be at work and won't be able to attend.

New Business

EMS Report – no further comments made.

Police Report – no further comments made.

Public Works Report – Mike Meenan didn't include the mileage report; he would have it included in the next report. Mayor Daniels thanked him for everything; he knows he just had surgery last week and appreciates him attending tonight's meeting.

Resolutions

116-16 Verizon Wireless – motion to approve made by Mr. Lopez; seconded by Ms. Smith-Hartman. Ms. Teleisa had requested checking to see if the coverage limits could be increased to \$1,000.000 from \$500,000; Verizon agreed to do so. All voted yes. Mr. Lopez commented that he was concerned at first about Verizon making this request; little did he know that there are some residents in the township that have no access to the internet; therefore he is supporting the motion.

125-16 Payment of Vouchers – motion to approve made by Mr. Lopez; seconded by Ms. Chang. All voted yes.

126-16 Approve Retirement Package for a Firefighter/EMT – motion to approve made by Mr. Lopez; seconded by Ms. Smith-Hartman. All voted yes.

127-16 Authorize Repairs to Engine 2723 – motion to approve made by Mr. Lopez; seconded by Ms. Smith-Hartman. Ms. Teleisa commented that the insurance company will be paying about \$50,000 in damages due to the accident; she thinks these repairs are cosmetic and not necessary (the repainting/reupholstering). It won't affect the operation of the truck at all. Mr. Lopez asked Fire Chief Craig Farnsworth to speak on this to justify the expense. Craig explained that the truck has corrosion damage from salt that needs repair; handles are falling off the truck. They thought it prudent to get these issues fixed while the truck is being repaired from the accident and out of service anyway. The seats are completely destroyed, there are holes in them, the padding is completely exposed. Their equipment is getting stuck on the upholstery. There are legitimate reasons to have these repairs done. It will add another 10-15 years of life to the truck which is in good shape mechanically, at least at this point. Mayor Daniels thinks the repairs are fair and reasonable. Mr. Lopez, Ms. Smith-Hartman and Mayor Daniels voted yes; Ms. Chang and Ms. Teleisa voted no.

128-16 Transfer of Appropriation Funds – motion to approve made by Mr. Lopez; seconded by Ms. Smith-Hartman. All voted yes.

129-16 Refund Taxes, 100% Disabled Veteran, Block 1001.08, Lot 3 – motion to approve made by Ms. Teleisa; seconded by Mr. Lopez. All voted yes.

130-16 Burlington County Municipal Park Development Program – motion to approve made by Mr. Lopez; seconded by Ms. Smith-Hartman. Ms. Chang asked what the exact amount was that was spent to preserve the Deacon Farm. Mr. Lopez believes that we started with \$450,000 and used last year's grant in totality for that. We still owe \$179,000 on this and if we secure the grant it would be used to pay this off. All voted yes.

131-16 Authorize Purchase of Sound System – motion to approve made by Mr. Lopez; seconded by Ms. Smith-Hartman. Ms. Teleisa wanted to clarify that this amount was already bonded for this year; Administrator Carrington confirmed that \$15,000 has been bonded for; the money is already there. Mr. Lopez has heard from many residents that there are problems hearing in the court room; this upgrade will install a permanent camera and microphones dedicated to each Committee person and each professional as well as a microphone for members of the public. All voted yes.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-67 et seq declares that affirmative action on the part of the Governing Body is required in fixing the rate of interest on delinquent taxes and other municipal charges. N.J.S.A. 54:4-67 has been changed to define a delinquent tax as follows:

Delinquency means the sum of all taxes and municipal charges due on a given parcel of property covering any number of quarters or years. The governing body may also fix a penalty to be charged to a taxpayer with a delinquency in excess of \$10,000.00 who fails to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year. The penalty so fixed shall not exceed 6% of the amount of the delinquency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. That the Township Committee hereby designates the rate of interest to be charged for the non-payment of taxes and other municipal charges in the event that any payment shall not be made within ten (10) days after the date same is payable, to be eight percent(8%) on the first one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) of delinquency and eighteen percent (18%)on any amount in excess thereof, which shall be computed and charged to the principal sum due.

In addition the Township Committee hereby fixes an additional penalty of six percent (6%) to be charged to a taxpayer whose unpaid delinquency exceeds
 \$10,000.00 on the last working day of the calendar year.

AUTHORIZE ASSESSOR TO FILE APPEALS WITH THE BURLINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF TAXATION AS MAY BE NECESSARY

CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON, IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY

RESOLUTION NO. 34-17

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

This Cash Management Plan (the "Plan") is prepared pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14 in order to set forth the basis for the deposits ("Deposits") and investment ("Permitted Investments") of certain public funds of the Township of Westampton, pending the use of such funds for the intended purposes. The Plan is intended to assure that all public funds identified herein are deposited in interest bearing Deposits or otherwise invested in Permitted Investments hereinafter referred to. The intent of the Plan is to provide that the decisions made with regard to the Deposits and the Permitted Investments will be done to insure the safety, the liquidity (regarding its availability for the intended purposes), and the maximum investment return within such limits. The Plan is intended to insure that any Deposit or Permitted Investments matures within the time period that approximates the prospective need for the funds deposited or invested so that there is not a risk to the market value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.

IDENTIFICATION OF FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS TO BE COVERED BY THE PLAN.

The Plan is intended to cover the deposit and/or investment of the following funds and accounts of the Township of Westampton:

Current Fund General Capital Fund Trust Fund

It is understood that this Plan is not intended to cover certain funds and accounts of the Township of Westampton.

DESIGNATION OF OFFICIALS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON AUTHORIZED TO MAKE DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS UNDER THE PLAN.

The Chief Financial Officer of the Township of Westampton is hereby authorized and directed to deposit and/or invest the funds referred to in the Plan. Prior to making any such Deposits or any Permitted Investments, such officials of the Township of Westampton are directed to supply to all depositories or any other parties with whom the Deposits or Permitted Investments are made a written

copy of this Plan which shall be acknowledged in writing by such parties and a copy of such acknowledgement kept on file with such officials.

DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORIES.

The following banks and financial institutions are hereby designated as official depositories for the Deposit of all public Deposit which are not otherwise invested in Permitted Investments as provided for in this Plan:

Investors Bank State of NJ Cash Management Any other institution containing a Government Unit Deposit Protection Act Notification (GUDPA)

All such depositories shall acknowledge in writing receipt of this Plan by sending a copy of such acknowledgement to the Designated Official(s) referred to in Section III above.

AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS.

- A. Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, he Designated Official is hereby authorized to invest the public funds covered by this Plan, to the extent not otherwise held in Deposits, in the following permitted investments:
 - (1) Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America;
 - (2) Government money market mutual funds;
 - (3) Any obligation that a federal agency or a federal instrumentality has issued in accordance with an act of Congress, which security has a maturity date not greater than 397 days from the date of purchase, provided that such obligation bears a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or other external factor;
 - (4) Bonds or other obligations of the Local Unit or bonds or other obligations of school districts of which the Local Unit is a part or within which the school district is located;
 - (5) Bonds or other obligations, having a maturity date not more than 397 days from the date of purchase, approved by the Division of Investment of the Department of the Treasury for investment by Local Units;
 - (6) Local government investment pools;
 - (7) Deposits with the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund established pursuant to section 1 of P.L. 1977, c.281(C.52:18A-90.4);or

- (8) Agreements for the repurchase of fully collateralized securities if:
 - (a) the underlying securities are permitted investments pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (3) of this subsection a;
 - (b) the custody of collateral is transferred to a third party;
 - (c) the maturity of the agreement is not more than 30 days;
 - (d) the underlying securities are purchased through a public depository as defined in section 1 of P.L. 1970,c.236(C.17:9-41); and
 - (e) a master repurchase agreement providing for the custody and security of collateral is executed.

For the purposes of the above language, the terms "government money market mutual fund" and "local government investment pool" shall have the following definitions:

Government Money Market Mutual Fund. An investment company or investment trust:

- (a) Which is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission under the "Investment Company Act of 1940," 15 U.S.C. sec.80a-1 et seq., and operated in accordance with 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7.
- (b) The portfolio of which is limited to U.S. Government securities that meet the definition of any eligible security pursuant to 17 C.F.R. sec. 270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such U.S. Government securities; and
- (c) Which has:
 - (i) attained the highest ranking or the highest letter and numerical rating of a nationally recognized statistical rating organization; or
 - (ii) retained an investment advisor registered or exempt from registration with the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the "Investment Advisors Act of 1940," 15 U.S.C.sec.80b-1 et seq., with experience investing in U.S. Government securities for at least the most recent past 60 months and with assets under management in excess of \$500 million.

Local Government Investment Pool. An investment pool:

- (a) which is managed in accordance with 17 C.F.R.sec.270.2a-7;
- (b) which is rated in the highest category by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization;
- (c) which is limited to U.S. Government securities that meet the definition of an eligible security pursuant to 17 C.F.R.sec.270.2a-7 and repurchase agreements that are collateralized by such U.S. Government securities;
- (d) which is in compliance with rules adopted pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L. 1968,c.410(c.52:14B-1 et seq.) by the Local Finance Board of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, which rules shall provide for disclosure and reporting requirements, and other provisions deemed necessary by the board to provide for and other provisions deemed necessary by the board to provide for the safety, liquidity and yield of the investments;
- (e) which does not permit investments instruments that: are subject to high price volatility with changing market conditions; cannot reasonably be expected, at the time of interest rate adjustment, to have a market value that approximates their par value; or utilize an index that does not support a stable net asset value; and
- which purchases and redeems investments directly (f) from the issuer, government money market fund, or the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, or through the use of a national or State bank located within this State, or through the use of a national or State bank located within this State, or through a broker-dealer which, at the time of purchase or redemption, has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to section 9 of P.L. 1967 c.9CC.49:3-56 and has at least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in U.S. Government securities and report daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York its position in and borrowing on such U.S. Government securities.

B. Notwithstanding the above authorization, the monies on hand in the following funds and accounts shall be further limited as to maturities, specific investments or otherwise as follows:

SAFEKEEPING CUSTODY PAYMENT AND ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RECEIPT OF PLAN.

To the extent that any Deposit or Permitted Investment involves a document or security which is not physically held by the Township of Westampton, then such instrument or security shall be covered by a custodial agreement with an independent third party, which shall be a bank or financial institution in the State of New Jersey. Such institution shall provide for the designation of such investments in the name of the Township of Westampton to assure that there is no unauthorized use of the funds or the Permitted Investments or Deposits. Purchase of any Permitted Investments that involve securities shall be executed by a "delivery versus payment" method to insure that such Permitted Investments are either received by the Township of Westampton or by a third party custodian prior to or upon the release of the Township of Westampton's funds.

To assure that all parties with whom the Township of Westampton deals either by way of Deposits or Permitted Investments are aware of the authority and the limits set forth in this Plan, all such parties shall be supplied with a copy of this Plan in writing and all such parties shall acknowledge the receipt of that Plan in writing, a copy of which shall be on file with the Designated Official(s).

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

On the fifteenth day of the following month during which this Plan is in effect, the Designated Official(s) referred to in Section III hereof shall supply to the governing body of the Township of Westampton a written report of any Deposits or Permitted Investments made pursuant to this Plan, which shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- A. The name of any institution holding funds of the Township of Westampton as a Deposit or a Permitted Investment.
- B. The amount of securities or Deposits purchased or sold during
- C. The class or type of securities purchased or Deposits made.
- D. The book value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.
- E. The earned income on such Deposits or Permitted Investments. To the extent that such amounts are actually earned at maturity, this report shall provide an accrual of such earnings during the immediately preceding month.

- F. The fees incurred to undertake such Deposits or Permitted Investment. To the extent that such amounts are actually earned at maturity, this report shall provide an accrual of such earnings during the immediately preceding month.
- G. The market value of all deposits or Permitted Investments as of the end of the immediately preceding month.
- H. All other information which may be deemed reasonable from time to time by the governing body of the Township of Westampton.

TERM OF PLAN.

This plan shall be in effect from January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017. Attached to this Plan is a resolution of the governing body of the Township of Westampton approving this Plan for such period of time. The plan may be amended from time to time. To the extent that any amendment is adopted by the Committee, the Designated Official is directed to supply copies of the amendments to all of the parties who otherwise have received the copy of the originally approved Plan, which amendment shall be acknowledged in writing in the same manner as the original Plan was so acknowledged.
