If you wish to be heard, come to the podium and give your name and address to the Clerk for the record. The amount of discussion of any single speaker will be limited to three (3) minutes. Large groups are urged to select someone to represent them. No speaker shall engage in any personally offensive, derogatory or abusive remarks. The Mayor shall immediately call to order any speaker who violates this provision. An officer of the WTPD may remove any disruptive person at the Mayor's discretion.

Public Comment is an opportunity for the public to present their views—both positive and negative. It is not a question and answer period. Neither the Mayor nor Committee Members will engage in a back and forth exchange so speakers are encouraged to present all their views. The Mayor as well as any Committee Member may respond to any comment after such speaker is finished. The Mayor may refer the speaker to the Township Administrator, Department Head or any Committee Member to respond in writing.
