## Public Comments on agenda items

Gary Berberian, 138 Winstead Drive—asked about the Municipal Court visitation report and if the inspection form was omitted.

## **Old Business**

KME ladder truck – Al Marmero had drafted a letter to KME regarding the extension of the warranty on the truck; Mr. Lopez explained the memo to the audience. The



Committee felt that an additional 18 months wasn't enough. The memo was pending the Committee's approval this evening and then it would be sent.

## **New Business**

Police Report – no further comments made.

EMS Report – the annual report was placed on the Township website; the Committee commended the Chief.

Public Works Report – Mike Meenan apologized for the late report. The new boom mower is up and running; training was conducted with all Public Works employees.

Proposed Westampton Township Spring Clean-Up Day, May 6, 2017 – Mayor Daniels explained that Kingdom Church had volunteered a day of service to clean up around Westampton Township. We need the approval of the Committee; this will be sooner rather than later if all residents are involved. Ms. Teleisa thinks it is a very good idea but she wants to see the church's certificate of insurance first; she is concerned about how many people it would cover, the ages of the people, etc. Mr. Lopez stated that a church should have their own certificate of insurance; we would need to see their certificate of insurance. This would have to wait until the liability issues could be determined. Solicitor Al Marmero said as long as the church has their own insurance it shouldn't be a problem but it is important if they are cleaning up on Township property.

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION VARIOUS CAPITAL **EQUIPMENT** AND COMPLETION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, **NEW JERSEY:** APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$465,000 THEREFORE; AUTHORIZING THE **ISSUANCE OF** GENERAL **OBLIGATION BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES** OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$441,750; MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND COVENANTS: AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN RELATED **ACTIONS** CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING

## **ORDINANCE 3-2017**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton, County of Burlington, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Township of Westampton, County of Burlington, New Jersey ("Township").

## Section 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the Township from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$465,000;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$441,750; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$23,250 for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11.
- <u>Section 3.</u> The sum of \$441,750, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, together with the sum of \$23,250, which amount represents the required down payment, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").

Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds of the Township in an amount not to exceed \$441,750 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.

Section 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Township in an amount not to exceed \$441,750 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting, engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, shall not exceed the sum of \$100,000.

Section 7. The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the amount of down payment for each said purpose; the maximum amount obligations to be issued for each said purpose and the period of usefulness of each said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

- Section 8. The average period of useful life of the several purposes for the financing of which this Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for said several purposes, is not less than 9.77 years.
- Section 9. Grants or other monies received from any governmental entity, if any, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of obligations issued to finance, the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.
- Section 10. The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$441,750 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- Section 11. The full faith and credit of the Township are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Township shall levy <u>ad valorem</u> taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.
- Section 12. The Capital Budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and available for inspection.
- Section 13. The Township hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the Township prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

## Section 14. The Township hereby covenants as follows:

- (a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by the Bond Ordinance is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;
- (b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations

## promulgated thereunder;

- (c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;
- (d) it shall timely file with the Internal Revenue Service such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and
- (e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.
- <u>Section 15.</u> The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the Township may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.
- <u>Section 16.</u> All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- Section 17. In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

## **RESOLUTION 2017-036A**

## OPPOSING THE TRANSCONTINENTAL GAS PIPELINE COMPANY (TRANSCO) COMPRESSOR STATION PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Transcontinental Gas Pipeline Company (Transco), a subsidiary of William Partners Company, is implementing an expansion project throughout New Jersey, including providing additional service to the New Jersey Natural Gas company to construct the Southern Reliability Link (SRL) Pipeline Project, and

WHEREAS, the project includes installation of a new 35,000 horsepower, electric motor-driven compressor station and associated electrical substation on the Transco Trenton Woodbury Lateral in Burlington County, N.J that feeds natural gas into the SRL Pipeline Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board of the Bordentown Sewerage Authority ("Authority") is concerned that the Transco Compressor Station will be used to transmit natural gas into the SRL Pipeline Project, which passes within 100 feet of over 140 homes along its route; and

WHEREAS, the Board of the Bordentown Sewerage Authority is concerned about the potential risks the Transco Compressor Station poses to the health and safety of the people in nearby homes and business; and

WHEREAS, it is understood that the Transco Compressor Station will be staffed by one person on weekdays only from 9am to 5pm, and will be remotely monitored by Williams/Transco from Texas the remainder of the week and entire weekend; and

WHEREAS, over the past three years, Williams/Transco Compressor Stations have experienced at least four explosions and fires, most recently in Branchburg, New Jersey, in which 13 construction workers were injured and two were hospitalized; and

WHEREAS, local firefighters are concerned they will have no ability to extinguish a gas compressor or pipeline fire, only to secure an area, while waiting for Williams/Transco to send workers to shut off the gas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of the Bordentown Sewerage Authority, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, the following recitals are incorporated as of March 20, 2017:

1. The Authority opposes the Transco Compressor Station

2. The Authority calls for a moratorium on any and all planning, proposal, surveying, or construction on the Transco Compressor Station

Because these projects will traverse and negatively impact numerous significant natural areas
and the resources of the municipality and the Pinelands region, the Authority requests a full
environmental review, be conducted to assess the myriad environmental consequences of the
project.

4. The Authority seeks the cooperation of other similarly located and affected municipalities, asking that all nearby affected municipalities adopt a similar resolution.

5. The Authority adopts, and calls upon similarly situated municipalities to adopt a resolution authorizing each entity to join together to enter their appearance in any proceeding before the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Federal Energy Regulatory, and any other regulatory authority, so that by their strength of numbers they may successfully oppose this project projects and have the ability to cause the termination of the project so as to prevent environmental degradation and to protect the public health and safety.
