NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, as follows:

That the Township Committee hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) may be made public at a time when the Township Attorney advises the Township Committee that the disclosure of the discussion will not detrimentally affect any right, interest or duty of the Township or any other entity with respect to said discussion.
- 3. That the Township Committee for the aforementioned reasons hereby declares that the public is excluded from the portion of the meeting during which the above discussion shall take place and hereby directs the Township Clerk to take the appropriate action to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.

# **RESOLUTION NO. 27-22**

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Lumberton and the Township of Westampton are Municipalities located in the County of Burlington; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Lumberton has the equipment necessary to provide vehicle fueling services; and
