NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 2. That the Township Committee hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) may be made public at a time when the Township Attorney advises the Township Committee that the disclosure of the discussion will not detrimentally affect any right, interest or duty of the Township or any other entity with respect to said discussion.
- 3. That the Township Committee for the aforementioned reasons hereby declares that the public is excluded from the portion of the meeting during which the above discussion shall take place and hereby directs the Township Clerk to take the appropriate action to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.

The Criminal Intelligence Unit is investigating a burglary and theft of cooper wire from the Verizon Wireless cell towers located at 27 East Park Drive. Investigation at the scene revealed that entry to the building had been gained through the suspect(s) prying open the door. Once inside the suspect(s) used a ladder normally found inside the building to assist with cutting cooper wiring which was found to be inactive from the interior and exterior of the building. The incident occurred between 12/17/21 and 2/3/22.

The Criminal Intelligence Unit is investigating a burglary to Pepperoni's Pizza located at 71 Springside Road which occurred on 2/6/22. Investigation at the scene revealed, the suspect(s) gained entry to the business by shattering the glass to the front door. Once inside the suspect(s) stole the cash register containing approximately \$150 in cash from the counter before leaving location. The time frame of the burglary is between 2/5/22 at 10 PM and 2/6/22 at 6 AM.

The Criminal Intelligence Unit is investigating a past tense armed robbery which occurred on 2/8/22 at the Red Roof Inn located at 2015 Burlington Mt. Holly Road. Investigation at the scene revealed the victim met the male suspect the day prior in Cherry Hill where they exchanged numbers. Later that night they met up at the Wawa in Burlington to discuss a business deal. During this encounter the suspect directed the victim to get a hotel room at the Red Roof Inn and they would meet the next day so he could sell him XBox's and other electronic items. On 2/8/222, the male suspect and another black male arrived at the hotel and repsonded to the room where the suspect brandished a black handgun and demanded the money from the victim. The suspect then fled the hotel in a vehicle with a large amount of cash.

The Criminal Intelligence Unit are continuing to investigate two vehicle burglaries and a theft of a vehicle from J & S Auto Haus located at 1853 Burlington Mt. Holly Road which occurred on 1/3/22. Investigation at the scene revealed, a 2021 Dodge Charger SRT had its rear passenger side window broken and the glove box ripped out with a car computer removed. A 2019 Jeep Cherokee was also found to have its rear passenger side window broken out. A 2018 Jeep Grand Cherokee SRT valued at \$64,999 was also found missing from the lot. A review of surveillance video located a suspect vehicle, a black Dodge Durango entering the lot at 5:21 AM remaining on location for approximately one hour. Several suspects were observed on video in the area of the damaged vehicles and stealing the Dodge Durango. On 2/3/22 the stolen vehicle was located in Camden and was processed by Camden PD's Crime Scene Unit. The Criminal Intelligence Unit is currently collaborating with several jurisdictions and the NJSP Motor Vehicle Crimes Unit who are experiencing high end vehicle thefts.

The Criminal Intelligence Unit are continuing to investigate a residential burglary which occurred on 12/22/21 on Fieldcrest Drive. Investigation at the scene revealed that after an unsuccessful attempt to pry open the rear sliding glass door of the residence, the suspect(s) forced entry to a rear window of the residence, causing damage to the screen, window frame and glass to the window. Once inside, the suspect(s) entered a couple of bedrooms located on the second floor of the residence, rummaging through dresser drawers and closets containing personal items of the victims, before leaving the residence with a safe and jewelry.

## <u>Roads</u>

**Brush:** Crews had a very light month with brush picking up a total of 14.26 tons of brush rotation took 3 days to complete.

**Street Repairs:** We have started our pothole repair rotation in the town. DPW is working in a timely manner to get the potholes filled in though out the town. During the windstorm that occurred on 2-18 a tree came down on the fence in Rolling Hills that is adjacent to Westampton Courts, a small crew of guys removed the tree and fixed the fence. Lastly, DPW was assisted By Nelson Tree service to remove a tree on Lambert Dr. at no cost to the Twp.

**Recycling:** A normal flow of requests for new cans and lid repairs continue, DPW is currently out of new cans, new cans are on order through the county just waiting for them to come in. We are fine with lid replacements and will continue to service those requests in a timely fashion.

**Leaf Collection:** DPW crews have found a window of opportunity in the weather to wrap up leaf cleanup on Township owned properties. Spring Cleanup will start approximately the second week in April. All info for that will be on the Township website.

**Grass:** Cutting is wrapped up for the season.

**Snow:** The month of February brought minor nuisance storms to the town, and no plowable events this month. On 2-5-2022 DPW were brought in to do after hours salting for icy roads, the rest of the minor occurrences happened during daylight operations and handled without problem.

## **Facilities**

**Municipal Building:** DPW did an excellent job painting the front office, copy room, and tax office on the second floor of the Municipal building. Westampton Township has been talking with Burlington County Special Services about having a work training program. Last week was the first week for this. Special Services started last week bringing one person over to assist with cleaning the building. Everything went well on both ends and are looking forward to continuing this relationship.

**Sport complex\Parks:** Water was turned back on in the concession stand in anticipation of maintance and repairs needing to be completed for the upcoming season. A hose bib was found to be leaking so DPW replaced it. One of the sinks in the bathroom was also found to be coming off the wall, a new bracket was purchased and the sink was reinstalled. We are also working on fence maintance on the sports complex grounds, a lot of the ties holding the fences up have come loose or are missing. DPW is working to re attach those areas.

**DPW Building:** Retro fitting of all the lighting in the DPW buildings has been completed. This will be a nice cost saver for the Township in maintance, materials, and the electric bill for our dept. Road maintance took place on the road going to the leaf pit, access back to the area was starting to be an issue.

## CALENDAR YEAR 2022 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS

## AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

## **ORDINANCE NO. 2-2022**

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Committee of the Township of Westampton in the County of Burlington finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Committee hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$107,951.34 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Committee of the Township of Westampton, in the County of Burlington, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Westampton shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$377,829.70, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Township of Westampton be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

## **ORDINANCE 3-2022**

BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND COMPLETION OF VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$1,256,150 THEREFOR; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE **GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS** OR ANTICIPATION NOTES **OF** THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, JERSEY IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF **UP TO \$1,193,340; MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS** AND COVENANTS: AND AUTHORIZING RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE **FOREGOING** 

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton, County of Burlington, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Township of Westampton, County of Burlington, New Jersey ("Township").

## **Section 2.** It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the Township from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$1,256,150;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$1,193,340; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$62,810 for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11.
- <u>Section 3.</u> The sum of \$1,193,340, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, together with the sum of \$62,810, which amount represents the required down payment, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").
- Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds of the Township in an amount not to exceed \$1,193,340 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.
  - **Section 5.** In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof,

the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Township in an amount not to exceed \$1,193,340 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting, engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, shall not exceed the sum of \$251,230.

Section 7. The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the amount of down payment for each said purpose; the maximum amount obligations to be issued for each said purpose and the period of usefulness of each said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

The average period of useful life of the several purposes for the financing of Section 8. which this Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for said several purposes, is not less than 10.18 years.

Section 9. Grants or other monies received from any governmental entity, if any, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of obligations issued to finance, the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.

The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Section 10. Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$1,193,340 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

The full faith and credit of the Township are irrevocably pledged to the Section 11. punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Township shall levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

The Capital Budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Section 12. Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and available for inspection.

Section 13. The Township hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the Township prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

### Section 14. The Township hereby covenants as follows:

it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds (a) or bond anticipation notes authorized by the Bond Ordinance is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;

- (b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder;
- (c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;
- (d) it shall timely file with the Internal Revenue Service such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and
- (e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.
- <u>Section 15.</u> The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the Township may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.
- **Section 16.** All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- <u>Section 17.</u> In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

## ORDINANCE NO. 4-2022

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON, IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY TO GRANT A DEED OF EASEMENT TO THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON FOR THE PRESERVATION OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT BLOCK 203, LOT 4, WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON.

WHEREAS, the Township of Westampton (hereafter referred to as "Township") is the sole and exclusive owner of certain land located in Westampton Township, Burlington County, State of New Jersey, known as the Sharpless Property, which land contains approximately 8.68 acres and is designated on the official Township tax map of Westampton Township as **Block** 203, Lot 4, (hereafter referred to as the "Property"); and

**WHEREAS**, protection, preservation and conservation of open space is a priority for Burlington County Board of Commissioners' (hereafter referred to as "County") local open space and recreation program; and

**WHEREAS**, the County and the Township wish to preserve and conserve the Property and ensure that the Property will be available for appropriate recreational purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, by Resolution #2021-00248 adopted on May 12, 2021, the County authorized execution of a cost-share agreement with the Township through which, the County agreed to participate in the Township's acquisition of the Property; and

**WHEREAS**, by adoption of Resolution No. 113-21 on September 21, 2021, the Township authorized execution of the cost-share agreement through which it agreed to convey a recordable deed of easement on the Property in exchange for the County's cost share; and

**WHEREAS**, the County's cost share for acquisition of the Property will be \$202,500.00, representing a 25 per cent contribution towards the Certified Market Value of \$810,000.00, as determined by the State Green Acres Program;

**WHEREAS**, the Easement attached hereto is entered into in accordance with the New Jersey Conservation and Historic Preservation Restriction Act (N.J.S.13:8B-1 et seq.) and shall be binding upon the Township and its successors and assigns and upon the County, its successors and assigns.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON as follows:

**Section 1**. **Recitals**. The recitals are fully incorporated herein.

**Section 2**. **Granting of Deed of Easement.** The Township is hereby authorized to grant A Deed of Easement to the Burlington County for the preservation and conservation of the property located known as Block 203, Lot 4 on the official tax map of the Township of Westampton commonly known as the Sharpless Property, and

**Section 3.** Execution. The Mayor of the Township of Westampton, in the County of Burlington is hereby authorized and directed, to execute on behalf of the Township any documents necessary to effectuate the granting of the Deed of Easement attached hereto.

**Section 4**. **Effective Date**. This ordinance shall take effect in accordance law.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

Box 6000, Mount Holly, NJ 08060, ("Grantee" or "Board")

## RECITAL:

WHEREAS, the Grantor is a body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey, part of whose statutory rights include preserving, protecting, and conserving open space; and

WHEREAS, the Grantor is the sole and exclusive owner of certain land located in Westampton Township, Burlington County, State of New Jersey, known as the Sharpless Property, which land contains approximately 8.68 acres and is designated on the official Township tax map of Westampton Township as **Block 203**, **Lot 4**, which is more fully described in Schedule A attached hereto (hereafter referred to as the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, protection, preservation and conservation of open space is a priority for the County's local open space and recreation program; and

WHEREAS, the Board and the Township wish to preserve and conserve the Property and ensure that the Property will be available for appropriate recreational purposes; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution #2021-00248 adopted on May 12, 2021, the Board authorized execution of a cost-share agreement with the Township through which , the Board agreed to participate in the Township's acquisition of the Property; and

WHEREAS, by adoption of Resolution No. 113-21 on September 21, 2021, the Township authorized execution of the cost-share agreement through which it agreed to convey a recordable deed of easement on the Property in exchange for the Board's cost share; and

WHEREAS, the Board's cost share for acquisition of the Property will be \$202,500.00, representing a 25 per cent contribution towards the Certified Market Value of \$810,000.00, as determined by the State Green Acres Program;

WHEREAS, the cost-share agreement authorized the Board and the Township to enter into this Deed Of Easement; and

WHEREAS, this Easement is entered into in accordance with the New Jersey Conservation and Historic Preservation Restriction Act ( $\underline{\text{N.J.S.}}$ .13:8B-1 et seq.) and shall be binding upon the Grantor and its successors and assigns and upon the Grantee, its successors and assigns.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum of \$202,500.00 (TWO HUNDRED AND TWO THOUSAND AND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS), the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and of the mutual covenants, terms, conditions and restrictions contained herein,

the Grantor does hereby convey to the Grantee, an easement in perpetuity, pursuant to the laws of New Jersey, for the exclusive purpose of assuring that the Property will be conserved and maintained forever for outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes and that uses of the Property that are inconsistent with these outdoor recreation and conservation purposes will be prevented or corrected.

## TERMS:

- 1. Grantor, for and in consideration of Grantee's payment used for the acquisition of the Easement, and pursuant to the New Jersey Conservation Restriction and Historic Preservation Restriction Act, N.J.S.A. 13:8B-1 through 13:8B-9 ("Conservation Restriction Act"), hereby transfers, assigns, and grants to Grantee, its successors, and its assigns,
  - a. a restriction on the Property for the purpose of restricting its use to outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes; and
- b. all development rights, except as specifically reserved to Grantor in this Deed of Easement, which are now or hereafter allocated to, implied in, reserved to, or inherent in the Property ("Development Rights"). Grantee shall not use, convey, transfer, or assign the Development Rights, and assigns to Grantor the concurrent right to enforce this restriction on the use of the Development Rights. The provisions of this Deed of Easement shall run with title to the Property and shall encumber the Property.
  - 2. It is the purpose of this Deed of Easement to ensure:
    - a. that the Property will be retained forever not only

for outdoor recreational purposes, but to also protect the Property from future development and to preserve the scenic and open space, the forested character, and natural resource values, its flora and fauna habitat, all herein deemed conservation purposes;

- b. that the Property will be used only for outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes, as defined, in the Open Space Preservation Bond Act of 1989, L. 1989, c. 183, in the Green Acres, Clean Water, Farmland and Historic Preservation Bond Act of 1992, L. 1992, c. 88 (collectively, "Bond Act"), the Garden State Historic Preservation Trust Act, N.J.S.A. 13:8C-3 et. seq., and in any regulations promulgated pursuant to the authority of the Bond Act ("Regulations"), now codified in N.J.A.C. 7:36-1.1 et. seq. (such purposes, collectively and individually, "Park Purposes");
- c. that development or other rights in or appurtenant to the Property will not be transferred to, or used for the benefit of, any other property;
- d. that the Property will not be used as open space set aside for or appurtenant to any other property or construction project pursuant to any local development ordinance;
- e. that the Property will be open and accessible for public use and enjoyment for outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes, and that access by the

general public to enjoy the Property for outdoor recreational activities shall be as provided, thus enabling the general public to enjoy the open space character, forested character, natural resource values, flora and fauna habitat, in conjunction with outdoor recreation and conservation purposes; and

- f. that any use of the Property contrary to the outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes of set forth herein will be prevented.
- 3. Purpose. It is the purpose of this Easement to assure that the Property will be retained for outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes as heretofore expressed forever to prevent any use of the Property that will impair or interfere with these uses.
- 4. **Prohibited Acts**. Any activity on or use of the public access areas or Property inconsistent with the purpose of this Easement is prohibited.
- 5. Rights of Grantee. To accomplish the outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes of this Easement the following rights are conveyed to the Grantee for the purpose of assuring compliance with this Deed of Easement:
- a. Enforcement. Grantee has the right to preserve and protect the outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes of the Property.

In the event of any violation of the terms and conditions of this Deed of Easement, Grantee may institute any proceedings to enforce these terms and conditions including the institution of suit to enjoin such violations and to require

restoration of the Premises to its prior condition. Grantee does not waive or forfeit the right to take any other legal action necessary to insure compliance with the terms, conditions, and purpose of this Deed of Easement by a prior failure to act.

- b. Inspection. Grantee and their agents shall be permitted access to, and to enter upon, the Property at all times for the purpose of assuring compliance with this Deed of Easement.
- c. Signage. Grantee shall be responsible for providing appropriate signage which identifies Grantee as a contributor towards the outdoor recreation and conservation preservation of said Property. Grantee shall only be responsible for providing such sign identifying Grantee as a contributor towards this preservation effort. Grantee shall be responsible for construction, erection, maintenance and other costs associated with placement of this sign only. Grantee will consult with Owner and Grantor as to the location of said sign so the placement of the sign will not interfere with the use of the property.
- 6. Responsibilities of Grantor and Grantee not affected. Other than as specified herein, this Easement is not intended to impose any legal or other responsibility on the Grantee, or in any way to affect any existing obligations of the Grantor as owner of the Property except where Grantor has agreed to the same. This shall apply to:
- a. Taxes. Grantee shall have no responsibility for payment of any taxes or assessments levied against the Property.

- b. **Upkeep and Maintenance**. Grantor shall continue to be solely responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the Property, except where Grantor has agreed to the same.
- c. Liability and Indemnification. Grantor shall hold harmless, indemnify and defend Grantee and its members, directors, officers, employees, agents, and contractors, and their successors and assigns from and against all liabilities, penalties, costs, losses, damages, expenses or claims, including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys fees arising from or in any way connected with injury to or the death of any person or physical damage to any property resulting from any negligent act, omission condition or other matter related to or occurring on or about the Property, as created by Grantor, regardless of cause, unless due solely to the negligence of any of the indemnified parties.

damages resulting from the Grantee's negligent use, maintenance or occupancy of the Property to the extent legally liable for such actions by the New Jersey Tort Claims Act, N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et. seq.

7. Remedies. The Grantee shall have the right to prevent and correct violations of the terms of this Easement. Enforcement of the terms of this Easement shall be at the discretion of the Grantee and any failure on behalf of the Grantee to exercise its rights hereunder shall not be deemed or construed to be a waiver of the Grantee of those rights. This shall be true regardless of the number of violations of the terms of this Easement by the Grantor that occur or the length-

of-time it remains unenforced.

If Grantee finds what it believes is a violation of the terms of this Easement, it may without limitation as to other available legal recourse, at its discretion take any of the following actions:

- a. Notice of Violation; Corrective Action. If

  Grantee determines that a violation of the terms of this

  Easement has occurred or is threatened, Grantee shall give

  written notice to Grantor of such violation and demand

  corrective action sufficient to cure the violation in accordance

  with a plan approved by the Grantee.
- b. Injunctive Relief. If Grantor fails to cure the violation within 30 days after receipt of notice from the Grantee, or under circumstances where the violation cannot reasonably be cured within a 30 day period, fail to begin curing such violation, or fail to continue diligently to cure such violation until finally cured, Grantee may bring an action at law or in equity in a court of competent jurisdiction to enforce the terms of this Easement, to enjoin ex parte the violation by temporary or permanent injunction, and to require the restoration of the Property to the condition that existed prior to such injury. Grantor acknowledges that any actual or threatened failure to comply or cure will cause irreparable harm to the Grantee and that money damages will not provide an adequate remedy.
- c. Damages. Grantee shall be entitled to recover damages for violation of the terms of this Easement, including, without limitation, damages for the loss of outdoor recreation

and conservation purposes. Without limiting Grantors' liability, Grantee, in its sole discretion, may apply any damages recovered to the cost of undertaking any corrective action on the Property.

- d. Costs of Enforcement. In any case where a court finds that a violation has occurred, all reasonable costs incurred by Grantee in enforcing the terms of this Easement against Grantor, including, without limitation, costs and expenses of suit and reasonable attorney's fees, and any costs of restoration necessitated by Grantor's violation of the Easement shall be borne by the Grantor.
- 8. Development Rights. Grantor hereby grants to Grantee all development rights or credits that are now or hereafter allocated to, implied, reserved or inherent in the Property, and the parties agree that such rights are terminated and extinguished, and may not be used on or transferred to any portion of the Property as it now or hereafter may be bounded or described, or to any other property adjacent or otherwise, nor used for the purpose of calculating permissible lot yield on the Property or any other property.

### 9. Owner and Grantor Warranties.

a. **Title**. Grantor warrants good and sufficient title to the Property, free from all encumbrances and hereby promises to defend the same against all claims that may be made against it. Grantor warrants the Property to be free from all mortgages, liens, encumbrances, restrictions, easements, covenants and conditions, except those that the Grantee determines do not interfere with its proposed use of the

Property.

- b. Hazardous Substances. Grantor hereby promises to defend and indemnify Grantee against all litigation, claims, demands, penalties and damages, arising from or connected with any release of hazardous waste or violation of federal, state or local environmental laws.
- amended only with the written consent of Grantee and Grantor and, if necessary, the written consent of the State of New Jersey Green Acres Program. Any such amendment shall be consistent with the purposes of this Easement and with the laws of the State of New Jersey and any regulations promulgated pursuant to those laws.
- 11. Interpretation. This Easement shall be interpreted under the laws of the State of New Jersey, resolving any ambiguities and questions of the validity of specific provisions so as to give maximum effect to its outdoor recreation and/or conservation purposes.
- 12. **Perpetual Duration**. This Easement shall be a servitude running with the land in perpetuity. Every provision of this Easement that applies to the Grantor or Grantee shall also apply to their respective agents, heirs, executors, administrators, assigns, and all other successors as their interests may appear.
- 13. **Notices**. Any notices required by this Easement shall be in writing and shall be personally delivered or sent by first class mail, to Grantor and Grantee at the addresses shown in the first paragraph of this Deed Of Easement.

- 14. Throughout this Deed, the singular shall include the plural, and the masculine shall include the feminine unless the text indicates otherwise.
- 15. Right of First Refusal. Grantor hereby gives the Grantee a Right Of First Refusal ("Right") to purchase a fee simple interest in the Property. The conditions of this Right shall be such that whenever Grantor receives a written offer from a person or persons to purchase all or any part of the Property, and Grantor accepts the offer subject to this Right, Grantor shall notify the Board by certified mail of the offer. The Grantee may elect to purchase the Property at the offered price and upon such other terms and conditions not less favorable to the Grantor than those contained in the conditionally accepted offer. Grantee shall have forty-five (45) days to elect to purchase the Property and will notify Grantor by certified mail of such election.

  - c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised, and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

### RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING PROMOTIONAL CRITERIA FOR SERGEANT FOR THE WESTAMPTON TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT

### RESOLUTION NO. 53-22

WHEREAS, the Township Committee needs to update their promotional policy for Sergeant that includes subjective and objective criteria;

NOW, THEREFOR, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton sets forth the following promotional criteria to be followed by the Westampton Township Police Department.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

1. All officers employed a minimum of three years as a police officer with the Westampton Township Police Department at the time of the posting are eligible to apply for the position of Sergeant.

### **TESTING ELEMENTS**

All Promotional examinations for positions within the Westampton Township Police Department shall be based upon a competitive examination given to all eligible and interested members of the Department.

- 1. Oral examination by a review board consisting of the one or more command level staff of the Westampton Twp Police Department, three or more commanding or superior officers from other law enforcement agencies and the Westampton Twp Administrator. (25 points)
- 2. Recommendations/evaluations made by each candidate's superior officer(s) within the last three years. Recommendations/evaluations made by Sergeants, Lieutenants, and Chief of Police. These recommendations shall be averaged. The recommendations/evaluations shall be completed on standard forms that fairly and objectively measure past and current performance and future capabilities for professional development. (25 points)
- 3. Review of past service record including commendations and disciplinary findings. (25 points)

- 4. Evaluation of educational achievements and accomplishments. Preference shall be given for associates, bachelors, masters and professional degrees in ascending order. Consideration shall also be given to police training and education. (20 points)
- 5. The most senior candidate shall be given an additional five points. In the event of equal seniority, the points shall be divided equally. (5 points)

### **NOTICE OF RESULTS**

Each element of the evaluation process will be weighted in the manner set forth above so that the total weight of all portions of the evaluation constitutes 100 points. The applicants will be ranked upon completion of all elements of the evaluation process. The results will be posted in writing to all candidates. The promotional list will be valid for a two-year period from the date of the list being established. The Chief of Police has the right to extend the promotional list for one more year after as long as it's done by resolution no later than sixty days from the expiration of the two years. Any candidate who wishes to review his/her results may do so within five days of the distribution of the results.
