Criminal Complaints / Arrests:

As a result of an investigation conducted by Ptl. Davis, Ronnie Henderson, 62 of Philadelphia was identified and charged with criminal attempt to commit theft by deception in the amount of \$442.99, related to an incident which occurred at the Home Depot on 10/28/21. This case is pending the processing of Henderson.

As a result of an investigation conducted by Det. Redfield, Christopher Mason, 57 of Morrisville, PA was identified and charged with theft. The charges stem from an incident which occurred at Severino Pasta, located at 600 Highland Drive, where double wheels from a tractor were removed, leaving it resting on wheel drums. A review of surveillance video located a male suspect and a white GMC Savannah van which assisted in the identification of Mason. Det. Redfield was familiar with Mason's modus operandi from a previous investigation of a theft of wheels from Medline Industries in August of 2021. Mason was charged with theft and is currently entered as a wanted person. This case is pending the arrest and processing of Mason.

As a result of an investigation conducted by Det. Redfield, Bestman J. Dartoe, 25 of Philadelphia, PA and Alpha Bah, 26 of Folcroft, PA were charged with robbery, unlawful possession of a weapon and certain persons not to possess a weapon. The charges stem from a robbery which occurred on 2/8/22 at the Red Roof Inn located at 2015 Burlington Mt. Holly Road. Investigation revealed that the victim met the male suspects the day prior where they discussed a business deal pertaining to the sale of merchandise for a profit. The suspects and the victim later the same day, met at the Red Roof Inn, where the suspects failed to provide the merchandise as discussed, but instead discussed how to use real money to make counterfeit. The suspects then brandished a black handgun and demanded the money from the victim. The suspect then left location in a BMW SUV, with one of the suspects leaving behind their cell phone. A search warrant was executed on the cell phone which subsequently led to the identification of the suspects. Bestman was arrested by Colwyn, PD in Pennsylvania and charged with fugitive from justice but was released after posting bail on the charge. Bestman has since made arrangements to turn himself in for processing on the related charges. Bah is currently incarcerated in the Delaware County Jail and awaiting extradition to New Jersey.

As a result of an investigation conducted by Det. Nagle, Francisco Cartegena, 45 of Winter Haven, Fl was charged with burglary theft and criminal mischief. The charge stems a burglary which occurred at a residence on Fernbrooke Drive on 11/29/21. Investigation at the scene revealed that the suspect(s) forced entry to the front door of the residence causing the wood casing around the door jam to splinter and the deadbolt to thrust forward throwing the door open. Once inside, the suspect(s) entered several rooms of the residence rummaging through personal belongings of the victim, before exiting the residence through the rear sliding glass door with an unknown amount of jewelry. The incident occurred between 1:55 PM and 3:20 PM. Additional information from a resident was provided that she observed a suspicious white SUV with a Texas registration, also providing a partial tag. She also provided information that she observed a male suspect walking in the neighborhood with a backpack. A review of local surveillance video located the white SUV described by the resident. Using the images of the suspect vehicle, Det. Nagle received information that the same vehicle was

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linked to over 25 burglary investigations in Pennsylvania, also gaining information on Cartegena as the suspect. Det. Nagle and Ptl. Welthy coordinated resources with the Manheim Police Department (Lancaster County PA) and a search warrant was conducted on the suspect's residence in Collingdale PA. During the search, a black backpack that belonged to the victim of the Westampton Burglary was located within the bedroom closet of suspect Cartegena. Additionally, a fraudulent Texas license plate was found in the suspect's vehicle that matched the witness information collected during the initial response by Westampton Patrol Units. Francisco Cartegena was arrested on scene and lodged in Lancaster County Jail for PA offenses. Subsequent to this investigation, Cartegena was charged with burglary, theft, and criminal mischief for the burglary that occurred on Fernbrooke Drive. The suspect is currently incarcerated awaiting court proceedings on all charges.

Other:

The Criminal Intelligence Unit is investigating a theft of catalytic converters from two Ford F 350 vans from Catholic Charities located at 595 Rancocas Road. Further investigation and review of surveillance video identified a suspect vehicle, described as a black in color, Chrysler 300, entering the property on 3/7/22 at 7:04 PM, remaining on the property for 37 minutes.

The Criminal Intelligence Unit are investigating a vehicle burglary to three box trucks belonging to Multi Housing Depot located at 97 Stemmers Lane which occurred on 2/15/22. Investigation revealed that a suspect gained entry to the vehicle's by breaking the passenger side door locks. Once inside, the suspect removed three EZ Pass transponders and left used transponders in the vehicles in an attempt to cover his tracks. A review of surveillance video,

identified a suspect vehicle, described as silver Jeep SUV.

The Criminal Intelligence Unit are continuing to investigate a residential burglary which occurred on 12/22/21 on Fieldcrest Drive. Investigation at the scene revealed that after an unsuccessful attempt to pry open the rear sliding glass door of the residence, the suspect(s) forced entry to a rear window of the residence, causing damage to the screen, window frame and glass to the window. Once inside, the suspect(s) entered a couple of bedrooms located on the second floor of the residence, rummaging through dresser drawers and closets containing personal items of the victims, before leaving the residence with a safe and jewelry.

Project Medicine Drop Report: During the month of March,11 pounds of medication was collected for destruction at a later date. In addition, the Quarterly Collection Report was submitted which revealed 39 pounds of medication was collected during the 1st Quarter of 2022.

Roads

Brush: Crews in March had a light month with brush picking up a total of 19 tons of brush rotation took 3 days to complete.

Street Repairs: Old man winter was a little rough on the roads this year. DPW completed two pothole patching rotations on Township owned streets. Our pothole crew was active on weather permitting days in the months of February and March. Crews spread a total of 12.4 tons of asphalt during these operations. Also during these operations, areas of concern in the road surface were noted so that a more permanent repair can be scheduled. Also roads with serious concern will be put on the paving list. A tree on Fort dr. was removed by a contractor after deeming the tree was dead. Unfortunately, the tree was too large of a risk for DPW to remove.

Recycling: A normal flow of requests for new cans and lid repairs continue, DPW is currently out of new cans, new cans are on order through the county just waiting for them to come in. We are fine with lid replacements and will continue to service those requests in a timely fashion.

Leaf Collection: Will resume in April.

Grass: Cutting is wrapped up for the season.

Snow: I couple of nuisance weather occurrences happened in the month of March, nothing the DPW had to get involved with.

<u>Facilities</u>

Municipal Building: DPW replaced a few emergency exit sign replacement after finding them to be inoperable. The Special Services student, Eric, has been doing a great job on

the day he comes cleaning the lobby and vacuuming different areas. He comes for a few hours on Wednesdays. If you see him say Hi!

Sport complex\Parks: DPW was active at the Sports complex the whole month of March in anticipation of opening day. The department prepped sports fields, painted facilities, repaired fences, repaired plumbing, and did the first grass cutting of the season. The quality of the work shows, Thanks to all involved! DPW has also assumed all grass cutting activities the complex this year. A contractor will be still doing the reseeding and fertilizer applications.

DPW Building: DPW started rehab on one of the sheds on our lot that's used to house mower equipment and supplies. They re-roofed the shed, cut out bad sections, and started installing steel panels left over from our pole barn builds. Once the panels are installed a coat of paint will be applied.

Rec. Center: The front door has been repaired by a contactor. Both hinges on the doors have been replaced with a heavy duty continuous hinge. Most of the damage issues appear after rentals of the facilities for parties.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE **TOWNSHIP OF** WESTAMPTON, COUNTY BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE AND SALE OF UP TO \$5,604,000 OF GENERAL **OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2022, OF THE TOWNSHIP** OF WESTAMPTON, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY; MAKING CERTAIN COVENANTS TO MAINTAIN THE EXEMPTION OF THE INTEREST ON SAID BONDS **FROM FEDERAL INCOME TAXATION:** AUTHORIZING SUCH FURTHER ACTIONS AND MAKING SUCH DETERMINATIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE TO EFFECTUATE THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE BONDS

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Bond Law, constituting Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton, County of Burlington, New Jersey ("Township"), has, pursuant to bond ordinances 2-2014, 10-2016, 3-2017, 3-2018, 3-2019, 4-2020, 6-2021, and 3-2022 (collectively, the "Bond Ordinances"), each duly and finally adopted and published in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law, authorized the issuance of general obligation bonds or bond anticipation notes of the Township to finance the costs of various capital improvements and the acquisition of various capital equipment, all as more particularly described in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, on June 1, 2021, the Township issued its Bond Anticipation Notes of 2021, Series A, in the principal amount of \$3,405,655 ("Notes") to temporarily finance a portion of the costs of the improvements authorized by bond ordinances 2-2014, 10-2016, 3-2017, 3-2018, 3-

WHEREAS, the Notes mature on May 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Township has not yet issued any obligations to finance the costs of the improvements authorized by bond ordinance 6-2021 and 3-2022 ("New Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Township to issue its general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$5,604,000 ("Bonds"), as further described in Exhibit "A", the proceeds of which, will be used to: (i) permanently finance the costs of the New Improvements; (ii) repay the principal of the Notes at maturity; and (iii) pay certain costs and expenses incidental to the issuance and delivery of the Bonds (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the Bond Ordinances, it is the intent of the Township Committee hereby to authorize, approve and direct the issuance and sale of such Bonds, to ratify and confirm certain actions heretofore taken by or on behalf of the Township, and to make certain related determinations and authorizations in connection with such issuance and sale.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WESTAMPTON, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL BOND LAW, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the Bond Ordinances, the issuance and

sale of the Bonds of the Township, to be designated substantially, "Township of Westampton, County of Burlington, New Jersey, General Obligation Bonds, Series 2022", in an aggregate principal amount of up to \$5,604,000 to finance the Project, is hereby authorized and approved. The Bonds shall consist of: (i) \$5,170,000 aggregate principal amount of General Improvement Bonds; and (ii) \$434,000 aggregate principal amount of Open Space Bonds.

Section 2. The Bonds shall be dated their date of issuance and shall mature on February 1, in the years and amounts set forth below:

The Business Administrator and/or the Chief Financial Officer of the Township is hereby authorized to adjust the maturity schedule of the Bonds set forth in the maturity schedules above in accordance with the Local Bond Law and specifically *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-26(g).

The term of the Bonds is equal to or less than the average period of usefulness of the Project being financed through the issuance of the Bonds. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable semiannually on February 1 and August 1, commencing February 1, 2023, in each year until maturity. The Bonds shall not be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturity dates.

Section 3. The Bonds shall be general obligations of the Township. The full faith and credit of the Township are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and, to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Township shall levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

The Bonds will be issued in fully registered book-entry-only form. One Section 4. certificate shall be issued for each of the Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds maturing in each year. Both the principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable in lawful money of the United States of America. Each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), which will act as securities depository ("Securities Depository"). The certificates will be on deposit with DTC. DTC will be responsible for maintaining a book-entry system for recording the interests of its participants or the transfers of the interests among its participants. The participants will be responsible for maintaining records recording the beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds on behalf of individual purchasers. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$5,000, integral multiples thereof, and in integral multiples of \$1,000 in excess thereof, or in such amount necessary to issue the principal amount of the Bonds, through book-entries made on the books and the records of DTC and its participants. The principal of and interest on the Bonds will be paid to DTC by the Township on the respective maturity dates and due dates and will be credited on the respective maturity dates and due dates to the participants of DTC as listed on the records of DTC as of the fifteenth (15th) day of the calendar month next proceeding an interest payment date. The Bonds will be executed on behalf of the Township by the manual or facsimile

signatures of the Mayor and Chief Financial Officer, attested by the Acting Township Clerk or the Deputy Township Clerk, and shall bear the affixed, imprinted or reproduced seal of the Township thereon.

Section 5. The Township is hereby authorized to make representations and warranties, to enter into agreements and to make all arrangements with DTC, as may be necessary in order to provide that the Bonds will be eligible for deposit with DTC and to satisfy any obligation undertaken in connection therewith.

Section 6. In the event that DTC may determine to discontinue providing its service with respect to the Bonds or is removed by the Township and if no successor Securities Depository is appointed, the Bonds which were previously issued in book-entry form shall be converted to Registered Bonds in denominations of \$5,000, integral multiples thereof, and in integral multiples of \$1,000 in excess thereof, or in such amount necessary to issue the principal amount of the Bonds ("Registered Bonds"). The beneficial owner under the book-entry system, upon registration of the Bonds held in the beneficial owner's name, will become the registered owner of the Registered Bonds. The Township shall be obligated to provide for the execution and delivery of the Registered Bonds in certified form.

Section 7. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to solicit proposals for and, if deemed necessary or beneficial, engage the services of a qualified financial institution to serve as paying agent for the Bonds ("Paying Agent"). The Chief Financial Officer hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the Paying Agent for the services to be provided if deemed necessary or beneficial.

Section 8. The preparation of a preliminary official statement ("Preliminary Official Statement") relating to the Bonds, and the distribution of said Preliminary Official Statement to prospective purchasers of the Bonds and others having an interest therein, are hereby authorized and directed. The Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Business Administrator and Acting Township Clerk are each hereby authorized to deem the Preliminary Official Statement "final", as contemplated by paragraph (b)(1) of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended ("Rule 15c2-12").

Section 9. The appointment of Bowman & Company LLP ("Printer"), to provide electronic and/or physical dissemination of the Preliminary Official Statement and Official Statement (hereinafter defined) is hereby authorized, approved, ratified and confirmed. The Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Business Administrator and Acting Clerk of the Township are each hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with Printer for the services to be provided.

Section 10. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell and award the Bonds at a public sale. The sale of the Bonds shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law, and the advertised terms of such public sale. If necessary or desirable, the Sale Official is hereby authorized to postpone, from time to time, the date and time established for receipt of bids for the sale of the Bonds in accordance with the Local Bond Law. If any date fixed for receipt of bids and the sale of the Bonds is postponed, the Chief Financial Official is hereby authorized to announce an alternative sale date at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to such alternative sale date. The Chief Financial Official is hereby authorized and

directed to cause a summary notice of sale and a notice of sale of the Bonds to be prepared and disseminated in accordance with the Local Bond Law. At the next meeting of the Township Committee after the sale and award of the Bonds, the Chief Financial Official shall report, in writing, to the Township Committee the principal amount, the rate or rates of interest, the maturity dates, the dates upon which interest on the Bonds shall be paid, the price and the purchaser or purchasers of the Bonds.

Section 11. The utilization of i-Deal LLC, New York, New York, to provide electronic bidding services to the Township in connection with the competitive sale of the Bonds ("Bidding Agent") through the use of the Bidding Agent's BiDCOMP/PARITY auction system, pursuant to the Local Bond Law and the regulations promulgated thereunder, is hereby authorized, approved, ratified and confirmed.

Section 12. The preparation of a final official statement ("Official Statement") with respect to the Bonds is hereby authorized and directed. Within seven (7) business days of the sale of the Bonds and in sufficient time to accompany any confirmation that requests payment from a customer, the Township will deliver sufficient copies of the Official Statement to the purchaser of the Bonds in order for the same to comply with Paragraph (b)(4) of Rule 15c2-12. The Mayor, Chief Financial Officer and Business Administrator are each hereby authorized to execute the Official Statement, and the distribution thereof to purchasers and others is hereby authorized and directed. The execution of the final Official Statement by the Mayor, Chief Financial Officer and Business Administrator shall constitute conclusive evidence of approval by the Township of the changes therein from the Preliminary Official Statement. The Mayor, Chief Financial Officer and Business Administrator are each hereby authorized to approve any amendments of or supplements

to the Official Statement.

Section 13. In order to assist the underwriters of the Bonds in complying with the secondary market disclosure requirements of Rule 15c2-12, the Mayor, Chief Financial Officer and Business Administrator are each hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Township an agreement with NW Financial Group, LLC., as dissemination agent, providing for the preparation and filing of the necessary reports in accordance with Rule 15c2-12 in connection with the Bonds.

Section 14. The Township hereby covenants that it will not make any use of the proceeds of the Bonds or do or suffer any other action that would cause: (i) the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code") and the Income Tax Regulations promulgated thereunder; (ii) the interest on the Bonds to be included in the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes; or (iii) the interest on the Bonds to be treated as an item of tax preference under Section 57(a)(5) of the Code.

Section 15. The Township hereby covenants as follows: (i) it shall timely file such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code with respect to the Bonds; and (ii) it shall take no action that would cause the Bonds to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.

Section 16. To the extent not otherwise exempt, the Township hereby covenants that, with respect to the Bonds, it shall make, or cause to be made, the rebate required by Section 148(f) of the Code in the manner described in Treasury Regulation Sections 1.148-1 through 1.148-11,

1.149(b)-1, 1.149(d)-1, 1.149(g)-1, 1.150-1 and 1.150-2, as such regulations and statutory provisions may be modified insofar as they apply to the Bonds.

Section 17. The Township hereby designates the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" as defined in and for the purposes of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code. For purposes of this designation, the Township hereby represents that it reasonably anticipates that the amount of tax-exempt obligations to be issued by the Township during the period from January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020, and the amount of obligations designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" by it, will not exceed \$10,000,000 when added to the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds.

Section 18. Application to Moody's Investors Service and/or S&P Global Ratings, acting through Standard & Poor's Financial Services LLC, for a rating of the Bonds, and the furnishing of certain information concerning the Township and the Bonds, for the purpose of qualifying the Bonds for municipal bond insurance, are hereby authorized, ratified, confirmed and approved.

Section 19. All actions heretofore taken and documents prepared or executed by or on behalf of the Township by the Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Business Administrator, Township Clerk, Deputy Township Clerk and other Township officials or by the Township's professional advisors, in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds are hereby ratified, confirmed, approved and adopted.

Section 20. The Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Business Administrator, Township

Clerk and Deputy Township Clerk are each hereby authorized to determine all matters and execute all documents and instruments in connection with the Bonds not determined or otherwise directed to be executed by the Local Bond Law, the Bond Ordinances, or by this or any subsequent resolution, and the signatures of the Mayor, Chief Financial Officer, Business Administrator, Township Clerk and Deputy Township Clerk on such documents or instruments shall be conclusive as to such determinations.

Section 24. All other resolutions, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby rescinded and repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.

Section 25. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption this 5th day of April, 2022.
