Training:

DSgt. Chieffalo, Det. Redfield, Det. Nagle and Ptl. Davis participated in Active Shooter Training conducted at the Burlington County Institute of Technology by the Westampton Township Police Department Firearms Unit.

DSgt. Chieffalo attended the Sexual Assault Virtual Symposium on 4/5/22, presented by the New Jersey Division of Criminal Justice.

Ptl. Davis attended the Domestic Violence Virtual Symposium on 4/6/22, presented by the New Jersey Division of Criminal Justice.

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Ptl. Davis is currently assigned to a 3-month rotation in the Criminal Intelligence Unit.

Criminal Complaints / Arrests:

On 4/1/22, it was learned that Roland Marrero 53 of Camden was incarcerated in the Salem County Jail on multiple charges, to include a shoplifting complaint out of Westampton. This complaint stemmed from an incident which occurred at the Wawa located at 76 Springside Road on 10/3/21. The investigation and charges were conducted by Ptl. Schallus, who entered Marrero in NCIC Wanted Persons. On 4/2/22, DSgt. Chieffalo coordinated the processing of Marrero with Salem County Jail.

As a result of an investigation conducted by Ptl. Davis, Robert G. Callahan, 59 of Westampton was identified as the suspect who committed a burglary and theft from three box trucks belonging to Multi Housing Depot located at 97 Stemmers Lane which occurred on 2/15/22. Investigation revealed that Callahan gained entry to the vehicle's by breaking the passenger side door locks. Once inside, Callahan removed three EZ Pass transponders and left used transponders in the vehicles in an attempt to cover his tracks. A review of surveillance video, identified a suspect vehicle, described as silver Jeep SUV, which ultimately led to assisting with the identification of Callahan. On 4/13/22, Ptl. Davis generated a criminal complaint charging Callahan with Burglary, Criminal Mischief, Identity Theft, Possession of Burglary Tools, Theft of Movable Property, Receiving Stolen Property and Criminal Trespass. This case is pending the arrest and processing of Callahan.

As a result of an investigation conducted by Det. Redfield, Michael L. Swift, 70 of Burlington was identified and charged with robbery. The charge stems from an incident which occurred at the CVS located at 71 Springside Road on 4/6/22 at approximately 8:54 PM. Investigation revealed Swift entered the CVS and passed a note to a juvenile employee which read, "I have a gun, empty out the drawer" and stated to the victim, "don't be a hero". As the employee retreated to the rear of the store to the call 911, the suspect fled on foot with the note. During the investigation, it was learned that Swift was the suspect in similar robberies throughout Burlington County and Mercer County. Det. Redfield, along with officer's from Evesham, Hamilton, Cinnaminson, and Delran, assisted Mount Laurel PD with the execution of a search warrant on 4/12/22 at Swift's residence in Burlington. Swift was arrested during the execution of the search warrant for charges out of Mount Laurel Township and lodged in the Burlington County Jail. On 4/22/22, Det. Redfield generated a complaint charging Swift with Robbery. Det. Redfield responded to the Burlington County Jail, serving Swift with his complaint and processing him on the related charge.

Other:

The Criminal Intelligence Unit are investigating the theft of four EZ Pass transponders from vehicle's belonging to Transervice Logistics, Inc located at 84 Stemmers Lane. The theft which was reported on 4/10/22, was observed by the company after they received bills from EZ Pass which were noticeably higher than normal. The theft of the EZ Pass transponders is believed to have occurred in February based on the billing activity.

The Criminal Intelligence Unit is investigating the theft of cooper piping from HVAC units located at 1920 Burlington Mt. Holly Road, the old Charlie Brown's Restaurant. The damage to

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the HVAC units and theft of cooper piping is believed to have occurred between 4/21/22 and 4/25/22, based on consistent inspections of the property which was recently for sale.

4/29/22 - DSgt. Chieffalo and Det. Nagle assisted Lt. Bieri with administering the Physical Fitness Test for new police candidates enrolled in the current hiring process.

Project Medicine Drop Report: During the month of April 11 pounds of medication was collected for destruction at a later date.

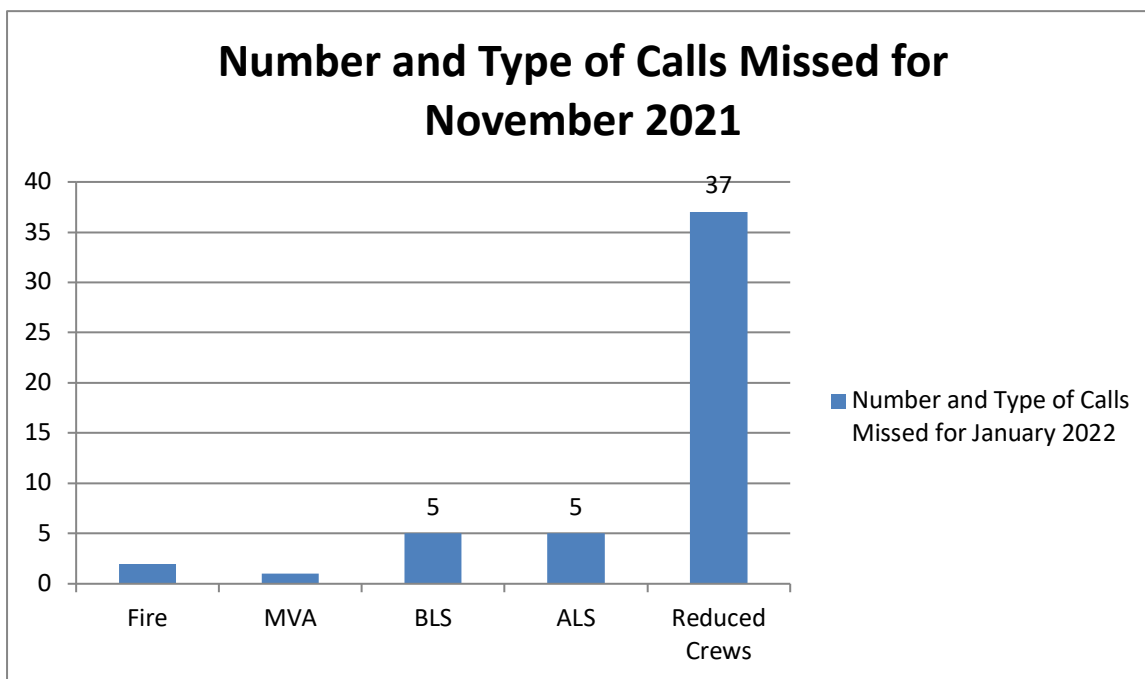

CHARACTER – INTEGRITY – ACCOUNTABILITY

The Westampton Township Emergency Services was dispatched to **399** calls for service for the month of **April 2022** for a total of **1,638** calls for the year. This is **111 calls more** than **April 2021** and an **increase of 472** calls year to date **2021**.

In **2022**, EMS calls account for **72%** of the departments call volume followed by **21%** for fire responses, lastly motor vehicle accidents make up **7%** of the Departments call volume. (<1% are missed/error call dispatches)

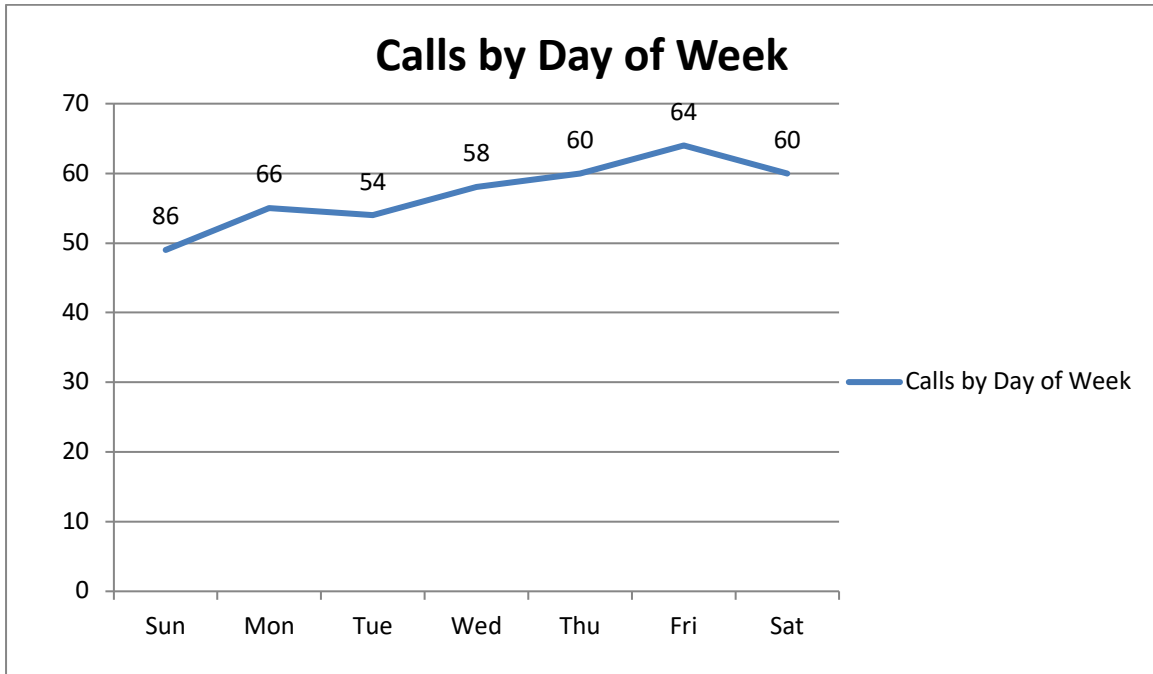


The department failed to respond to a total of **14** calls for the month. This represents **3%** of the total call volume. During the same time period the fire apparatus responded understaffed (3 or less) **47** times. This represents **47%** of total fire responses. Year to date the department has missed **47 (2%)** calls and responded understaffed **157 (45%)** times.

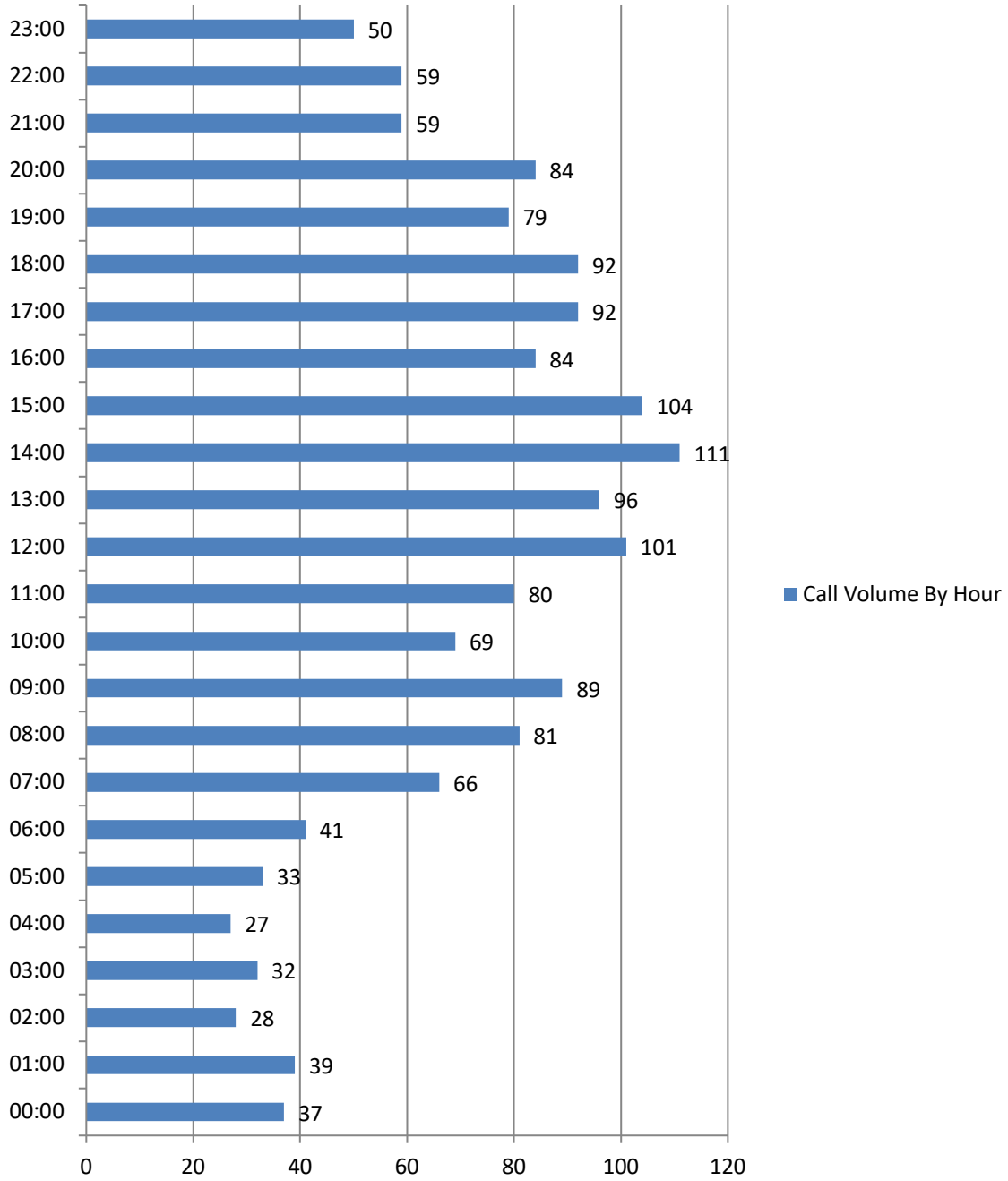

Call Volume By Hour YTD

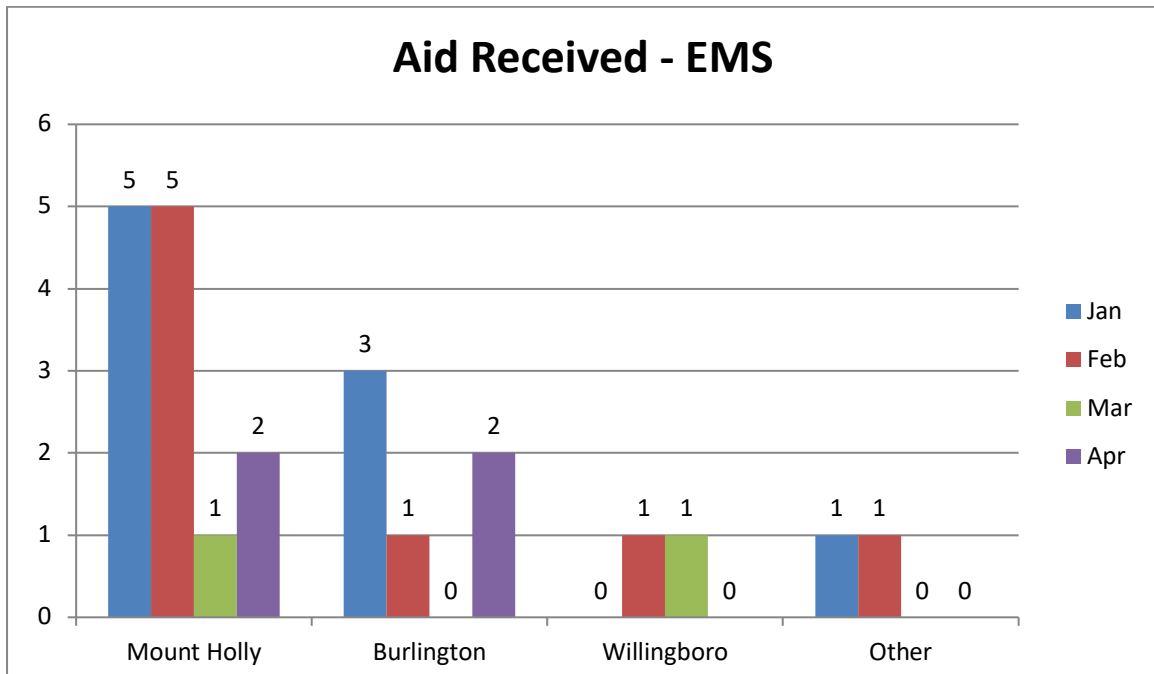

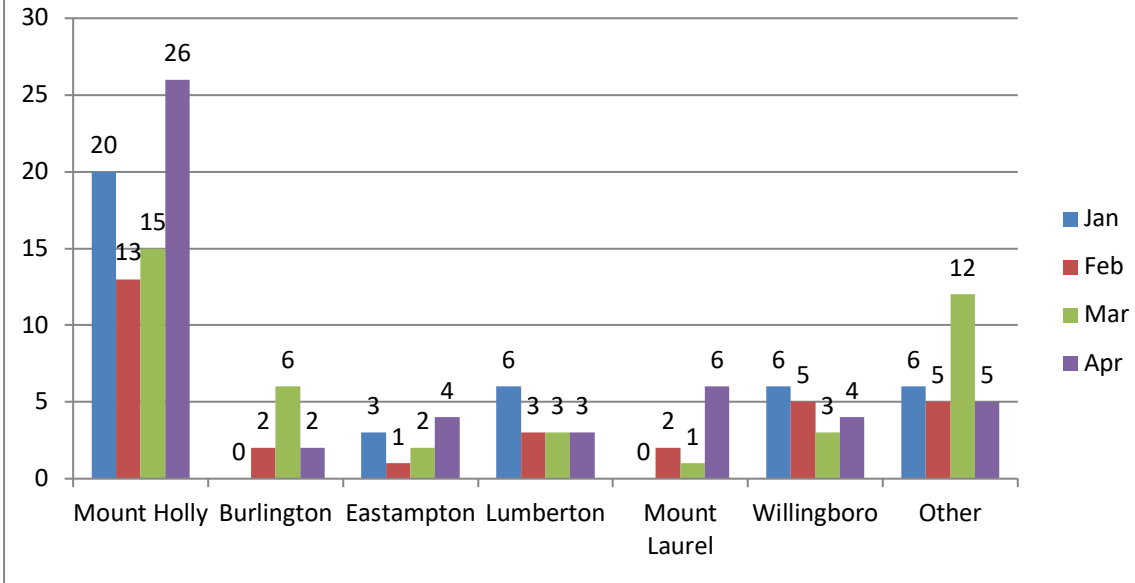




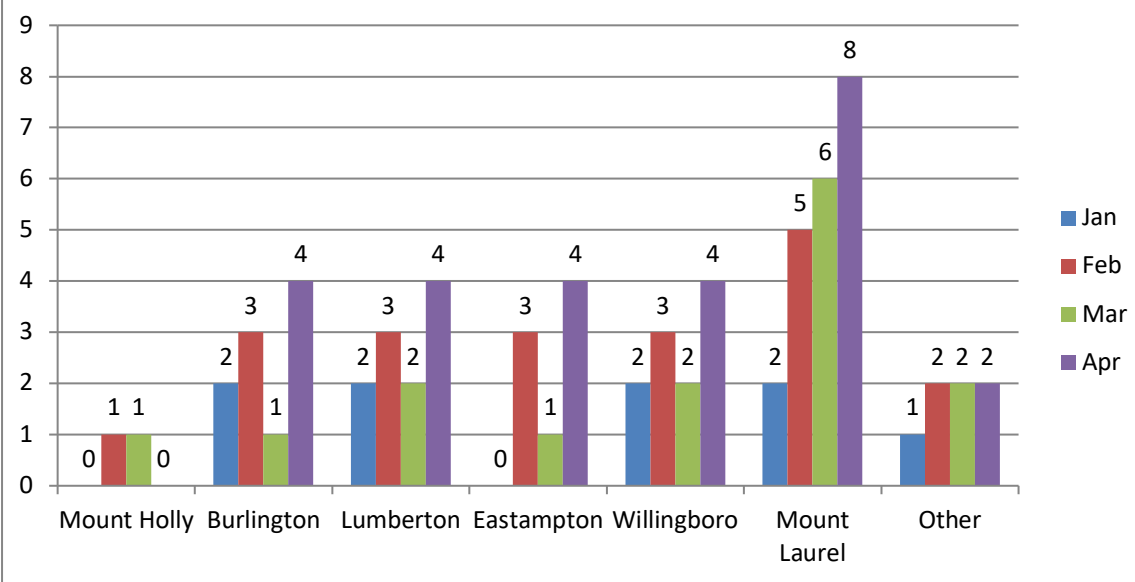

April 2022 Monthly Training Report

The month of April was busy month of training for the WTES, which conducted a total of **232.75** hours of training at the Firehouse, online and off site at various training facilities. Some highlights of the training activities this month were:

- Hazardous Materials Technician training conducted with the Cherry Hill Fire Department at the Burlington County Emergency Services Training Center.

Our staff was able to learn some new techniques and practice hands on how to stop leaking tanks containing simulated Hazardous Materials products.



- Our Firefighters attended an in-house training program about Structural Protection in The Wildland Urban Interface. Three of our staff members are also part time District Fire Wardens with the New Jersey Forest Fire Service, so we utilized their experience and knowledge to create a great training program for these unique, fast-moving incidents. While Westampton Township itself certainly has some areas in our community that have Wildland Urban Interface concerns, this training proved very beneficial when we recently responded mutual aid to Southampton Township for Wildfire threatening homes in Leisuretown.

- Our third noteworthy training event also occurred at the Burlington County Emergency Services Training Center, where our experienced driver pump operators worked with our newest Full Time Firefighter/EMT Alexandria Fitzpatrick on learning how operate the pump on Squad 2722, utilizing numerous hose streams at once. Allie has been working very hard on her required training and is quickly picking up the skills needed to move forward and become a certified driver/pumper operator.



- Lastly, Firefighter/EMT Michael Wolfschmidt led a half day long CPR and First Aid class for the staff of the Inductotherm Corporation First Aid Team. This group has been very helpful to us over the years by their quick response at their large, industrial complex. Having the staff of the WTES provide this training is extremely helpful in ensuring a high standard of care for the sick and injured at their facility before we arrive.

Roads

Brush: Brush collection this month picked up 23.55 tons of brush. The volume of brush stayed consistent this month, but because there were a greater number of stops, it took 6 days to complete.

Street Repairs: Things were pretty quiet in this area this month with just two calls for miscellaneous potholes.

Recycling: A normal flow of requests for new cans and lid repairs continue, DPW is currently out of new cans, new cans are on order through the county just waiting for them to come in. We are fine with lid replacements and will continue to service those requests in a timely fashion.

Leaf Collection: Leaf collection resumed this month, DPW completed two rotations of leaves though the entire town. That collection started on 4-12 and wrapped up on 4-25 at the end of the second rotation. 40 yards of leaves were collected this spring.

Grass: Grass cutting is in full swing and on track. Crews have been diligently getting sidewalks edged, high grass trimmed, and all the open areas mowed.

Snow: Snow season has been wrapped up for the season.

Facilities

Municipal Building: The back employee entrance has been sticking more frequently so DPW looked at it and determined it is in need of replacement. Quotes were obtained

and the door has been setup for replacement. The approximate cost to replace will be \$3,555.00.

Sport complex\Parks: DPW is in full swing with grass maintenance at the Sports complex and parks. One minor repair on a damaged door occurred but that was it for the month. Both dugout fences at spring meadows ball field were badly damaged one from storm damage last summer and the other by vandalism. DPW replaced the fencing and hardware that was damaged, no cost for materials were incurred. All materials used for replacement were on hand from previous jobs. Both dugouts are ready to be used this season.

DPW Building: The shed that DPW is rehabbing is almost complete. The project is currently a secondary project and is mainly completed in off times. It will be wrapped up shortly. There are no costs associated with this project currently, since we are using up materials left from previous jobs.

AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THE SAME.**

RESOLUTION NO. 82-22

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. as amended and supplemented, ("Act") provides a process for Redevelopment Entities to participate in the redevelopment and improvement of areas designated as in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, on February 6, 2018, the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton (the "Committee") adopted Resolution 43-18 authorizing and directing the Westampton Township Land Development Board (the "Board") to conduct a preliminary investigation (the "Preliminary Investigation") to determine whether Block 805, Lot 1 (the "Project Area" or "Redevelopment Area") satisfies the criteria under the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the "Redevelopment Law") for designation as a Non-Condensation Redevelopment Area and to prepare a redevelopment plan if such designation is made in accordance with the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, the Board held the requisite public hearing on the Preliminary Investigation and on May 2, 2018, adopted Resolution 8-2018 recommending that the Committee designate the Study Area as a Non-Condensation Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, on October 16, 2018, the Committee accepted the recommendation of the Board and adopted Resolution 142-18 designating the Study Area as a Non-Condensation Redevelopment Area (hereinafter, the "Redevelopment Area") in accordance with the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 8-2018, the Committee adopted a redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, Redeveloper is currently the owner of the Property and has proposed a conceptual plan to redevelop the Property with the construction of two (2) hotels, a restaurant and drive-thru pad site (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Resolution No. 133-19, the Township conditionally designated the Redeveloper as exclusive redeveloper for the Redevelopment Area subject to the successful negotiation and execution of a redevelopment agreement and execution of an Interim Costs Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on May 19, 2020, the Township adopted Resolution 75-20 which extended the designation of Westampton Realty Urban Renewal, LLC as the conditional redeveloper of the Property for one year with an expiration date of June 17, 2021; and

WHEREAS, based upon changed circumstances, the Township Committee determined that it had become necessary to amend the redevelopment plan to provide for the redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area consistent with land uses the Committee believed were most desirable and beneficial to the Township; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7 of the LRHL, the Township Committee adopted Resolution 96-20 which authorized and directed the Land Development Board to amend the redevelopment plan for the Property and to transmit the proposed amended redevelopment plan to the Township Committee for review and adoption; and

WHEREAS, the Westampton Township Land Development Board commenced and completed the process to amend the Redevelopment Plan, and in accordance with the N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7 of the LRHL, adopted Resolution 21-2020 providing its report and recommending that the Township Committee adopt the proposed amended redevelopment plan prepared by Barbara J. Fegley, AICP, PP, of Environmental Resolutions, Inc. entitled, "Amended Redevelopment Plan, 2015 Burlington-Mount Holly Road, County Route 541, Block 805, Lot 1, Westampton Township, Burlington County, New Jersey," dated July 25, 2020 (the "Amended Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 15-2020, the Committee adopted an amended redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area (the "Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Redeveloper will implement the development, design, financing and construction of the Project in conformity with the Redevelopment Plan and in accordance with the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8(e) and (f) of the Redevelopment Law authorize the Township to enter into contracts or agreements for the planning, construction or undertaking of any development project or redevelopment work in an area designated as an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Law provides that the Township may designate the Redeveloper and approve the Redevelopment Agreement through resolutions of the Township Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Redeveloper has applied for site plan approval to the Westampton Joint Land Use Board; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee desires to extend the Redevelopment Plan, the designation of the Redeveloper and approve the execution of an amendment to Redevelopment Agreement on behalf of the Township;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Westampton, County of Burlington, and State of New Jersey that Westampton Realty Urban Renewal, LLC is hereby continued as the designated Redeveloper for the Project Site as for the duration of the Redevelopment Agreement as amended herein; and

Project Description and Site Plan

(Revised May 10, 2022)

Westampton Realty Urban Renewal, LLC is the titled owner of the Applicant of the approximate six (6) plus or minus acres of Block 805, Lot 1, the site located at the north side of the turnpike entrance on Route 541 in the township. The project which is the subject of an Approved Redevelopment Plan encompasses part of the overall Block 801, Lot 1. The parcel had been divided into three condominium lots, C-101, C-102, and C-103. The currently existing Red Roof Inn motel is situated on Lot C-102. That parcel titled in the name of "Westampton Hospitality, LLC" is not directly part of the Redevelopment Plan which applies to C-101 and C-103. The overall property was originally built out in 1953 and 1954 as the site of a Howard Johnson restaurant and motel shortly after the New Jersey Turnpike Interchange 5 was completed. Over the next 60 years, the motel was added onto, the brand name changed from Howard Johnson's, the restaurant changed hands and finally closed, and lastly, in 2018, all the structures on the site were demolished except for the presently standing Red Roof Inn, which was the site of the original Howard Johnson's motel building. The inn is operated by the title owner, Westampton Hospitality, LLC, an entity the sole member of which Avani B. Gandhi; (C-102) she is also the sole member of Westampton Realty Urban Renewal, LLC, owner of the remaining condominium parcels.

The applicant proposes to continue the Red Roof Inn facility (Phase 2) separate and apart from the parcels which are subject to possible future application for long-term tax benefits. The applicant will add two Hilton branded hotels (Phases 3 and 4) to the south side of the property, (C-103) one of which will be an extended stay facility. The hotels will be in one building connected by shared reception area, conference rooms, entrance, etc. Along Rt. 541 on the north side of the site, (C-101) a national brand restaurant and bar facility (Phase 1) is proposed. Also, on the south side along Rt. 541 will be another stand-alone building for a yet to be determined use (Phase 1), but probably a drive-through occupant such as Starbucks coffee. The freestanding signs located on the property will be refurbished and the two advertising signs (one facing northbound turnpike roadway and the other facing Rt. 541 southbound are currently approved and licensed by the appropriate authorities and will be refurbished. All the proposed improvements are shown on the attached Approved Redevelopment Plan. The new hotel buildings may be modular construction stick built in the style of Hilton's other national branding facilities. They will probably have a composite masonry type material on the outside surfaces. The new restaurant will be in the tenant's typical national brand style, as well as the second potential drive-through building.

The extended stay Hilton Hotel will have sufficient kitchen facilities for short-term stays. However, any approval language will prohibit any long-term residential uses. Other than those restrictions,

there are no other restrictions for the potential use of the subject facilities. There are no age restrictions or other type of group restrictions applicable to the project. The timing and planning of the overall project has changed dramatically since originally proposed. This is partly because the market conditions affecting construction capabilities have been dramatically impacted by the pandemic, and partly because the market and financing for the proposed facilities has changed nationally and locally since the original projections were made. Further, the applicant has inserted a phasing scheme in the site plan approval process that is more realistic in the present overall hospitality market conditions and construction industry.

This project has been on the redevelopment planning process with the Township's assistance for almost three and a half years. It had been substantially derailed by the impact of the pandemic and all the economic uncertainties it has created for the past 2 years. But the applicant believes if the project is going to come to fruition, it must go forward now or lose its momentum. It's preliminary and major site plan applications are presently awaiting hearing before the Township Land Development Board just waiting for the Committee's extension of the Plan, and amendment of the agreement with the Township to address the current status of the project.

WHEREAS, in 2019, 36.7% of students reported persistent feelings of sadness or hopelessness; nearly 19% of high school students had seriously considered attempting suicide; and

WHEREAS, suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among high school-aged youth ages 14-18; in 2018, a total of 48,344 persons of all ages died from suicide and where suicide was the 10th leading cause of death overall in the United States; and

WHEREAS, according to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration mental health problems are more common than cancer and heart disease combined, and more than half of all Iraq and Afghanistan veterans hospitalized at VA hospitals are treated for mental illness according to the Veteran's Administration; and

WHEREAS, the stigma associated with the disease of mental illness is identified as the primary roadblock to recovery; and

WHEREAS, when severe mental illness goes untreated or under-treated, it can lead to alcohol or substance abuse, dropping out of school, unemployment, homelessness, or suicide; and

WHEREAS, raising awareness of mental illness is an effective way to reduce the stigma associated with the disease and encourage those who are affected to seek services and support; and
